•Pre-Apprenticeship Beaufort County •

Pre-apprenticeship programs are designed to provide students with the skills and knowledge needed to successfully transition to a Registered Apprenticeship program. Pre-apprenticeship programs are regulated and governed by the ApprenticeshipNC and the US Department of Labor. A pre-apprenticeship program typically includes classroom instruction, on-the-job training, and job shadowing; all with the goal of exposing participants to the work environment for a targeted occupation. Successful completion of a pre- apprenticeship program improves the chances of participants gaining acceptance into a registered apprenticeship program.

What are the benefits to students?

The pre-apprenticeship program provides many benefits to participants:

- explore a new career pathway and occupation
- •benefit from classroom instruction and on-the-job training
- •improve chances of acceptance into a Registered Apprenticeship program with a local employer; providing full-time employment, a progressive wage, and a debt-free college credential
 - •up to two high-school credits (fall/spring) that count towards graduation requirements

What are the benefits to employers?

The pre-apprenticeship program provides many benefits to local employers:

- access to a diverse and qualified, job-ready applicant pool
- control over quality and content of training
- increase employee retention rates

Apprenticeship Beaufort County currently offers pre-apprenticeship programs for five occupations with four partnering employers.

Occupations:

- 1. **Injection Molding Technician**-perform activities related to production output in the injection molding department; performs start-up and interval inspections as required. Collects and inputs required data to maintain production and quality related statistics. Inspects and packages product to required standards. Perform at least 25% of all molding production operations, with minimal supervision.
- 2. **Production Process Technician**-operate equipment, monitor processes and document results following standard operating procedures. Involved in all stages of the manufacturing process.
- 3. **Maintenance Technician**-handle repairs and maintenance of building, grounds, machinery and equipment.
- 4. **Welding Technician**-use hand-welding or flame-cutting equipment to weld or join metal components or to fill holes, indentations, or seams of fabricated metal products.
- 5. **Electrical Lineman**-install or repair cables or wires used in electrical power or distribution systems.
- 6. **Paramedic-** administer emergency medical care and assess injuries and illness. Can administer medication, use medical equipment, and administer life support to sick or injured individuals.

- **7. Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-** administer care for patients at the scene of an incident and while in transport to a hospital. Can assess patient's condition and manage repiratory, cardiac, and trauma emergencies.
- **8. Boatbuilding/Composite Technician-** manufacture the fiberglass or other matieral composite parts needed to construct components of a boat in a safe and organized area.

**Prerequisite requirements: Students must be in the 11th or 12th grade with an unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher <u>OR</u> a Career Readiness Certificate at a minimum of a bronze level <u>OR</u> present passing scores on a BCCC placement exam, successfully passed Math I and II, successfully passed two Career and Technical Education courses, and have the written recommendation of a Career & Technical Education staff member or a school administrator.
