Tests are administered in the Testing Center, Bldg. 9-927. Allow plenty of time to avoid rushing. Relax before the testing begins.

Placement testing is mandatory for all students taking curriculum level courses with a developmental prerequisite. **All testing is done by appointment and an admissions application must be completed prior testing.** To schedule an appointment, call the Admissions office at 252-940-6237.

Placement Testing may be waived under the following conditions:

- The student receives transfer credit for appropriate developmental course work.
- The student receives transfer credit for ENG 111 and the first required curriculum mathematics course.
- The student holds an associate degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution in which English was the language of instruction.
- ACT reading score of 22 or ACT English score of 18 and ACT math score of 22.
- SAT scores- see admissions.
- ASSET and COMPASS test scores are accepted.

All test scores are valid for 5 years from the date of the test.
